Activity Report:

In connection with the Appendix 4C; Quarterly Cash Flow Report entities subject to listing rule 4.7B, the Directors are pleased to give the following report on the activities undertaken during the past quarter ending 30th June 2022.

During this period, the Company has continued to implement all of the necessary and suggested recommendations of national and local regional level governments in all areas where it is working in relation to the ongoing COVID-19 Coronavirus Pandemic.

Expenses incurred during the quarter includes PT Energi Sengkang payment for gas purchases, power plant operation and maintenance costs (for Indonesia), staff costs, business administration, site security costs, and where possible, preservation of assets on project development sites, in Philippines and Indonesia.

Within the Appendix 4C (item 6.1), we disclosed payment to related parties of USD5.176 million. This relates to payments to PT. CEPA for the O&M Contract for the Sengkang Power Plant.
