

September 2023 Quarterly Activities Report

Albion Resources Limited (ASX: ALB) ("Albion" or the "Company") is pleased to provide the following summary of activities conducted over the September 2023 quarter.

Mongers Lake Project:

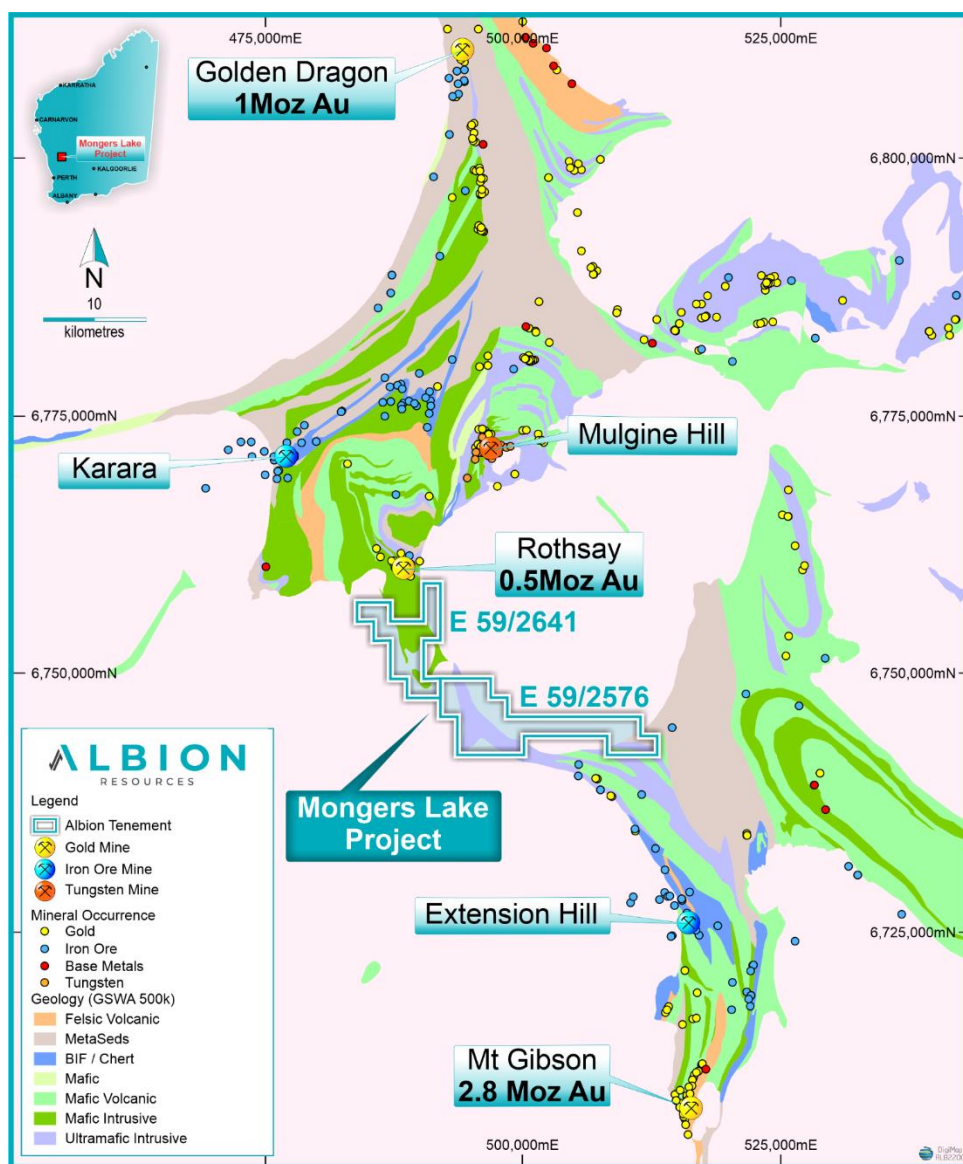


Figure 1: Mongers Lake Project Location Map on GSWA 500k Geology

The Mongers Lake Project covers a portion of the Yalgoo-Singleton Greenstone Belt in the Murchison Province of Western Australia, located between Capricorn Metals' Mt Gibson Gold Project and Silver Lakes' Rothsay Gold Projects (Figure 1). The Mongers Lake Project has been subject to limited historical exploration despite the regional prospectivity.

Recent Activities

Soil sampling results from the Mongers Lake project were reported by Albion in the June Quarter (See ALB announcement 6th June 2023). At the Red Well prospect, three significant coherent nickel-copper-platinum-palladium-in-soil anomalies that extend for a combined 3 km strike were identified.

During the quarter, the Company completed a review of Geoscience Australia's national SKYTEM data at Mongers Lake and identified 2 conductors which are coincident with previously announced Ni-Cu-PGM soil anomalies at the Red Well Prospect.

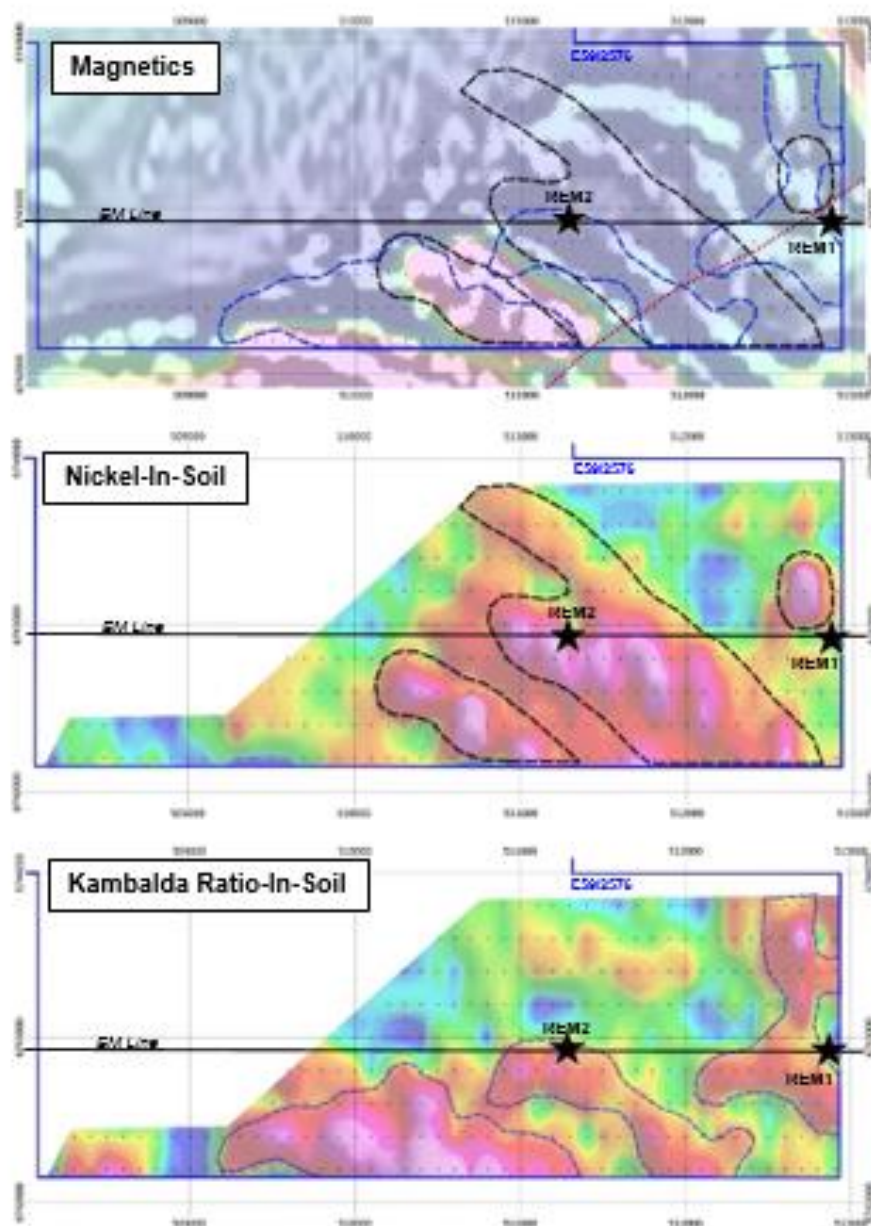


Figure 2A: (top) Airborne magnetic MrtpcMrtplap image showing EM anomalies (black stars), Ni-Cu-PGM (black dash), 'Kambalda Ratio' (blue dash) soil anomalies and cross structure (red dash).

On the eastern margin of the project tenure, in the Red Well prospect area, a strong basement conductor is identified called REM1 (Figure 2). This anomaly occurs within the high amplitude NW strike magnetic linears truncated by regional North-easterly faulting. Adjacent to this is another smaller basement conductor called REM2 (Figure 2).

The REM1 and REM2 bedrock conductor anomalies are highly prospective for the discovery of nickel-copper-PGM sulphide deposits. Bedrock EM anomalies and coincident geochemical Ni-Cu-PGM and Kambalda Ratio anomalies and coincident magnetic features are characteristic of classic magmatic nickel-copper-PGM systems typical of Archean greenstone terrains such as for example the Andover Ni-Ci-PGM deposit in the Pilbara (Azure Minerals Limited: ASX:ASZ) and other nickel sulfide deposits in Kambalda like those mined by Mincor Resources (ASX:MCR).

In light of the recent delineation of these high priority targets, it has been recommended to conduct ground based fixed loop EM (FLEM) across both targets and along strike in order to accurately define these anomalies for drill targeting.

Lennard Shelf Project:

Albion's Lennard Shelf Project is located in the world class Mississippi Valley type Zinc-Lead province, the Lennard Shelf, approximately 30 km southeast of Fitzroy Crossing in the Kimberley, Western Australia. Despite hosting significant historic mines, Pillara (19.3Mt @ 7.8% Zn + 2.6% Pb) and the Cadjebut Trend (16.4Mt @ 8.9% Zn + 5% Pb), regional exploration in the Lennard Shelf Province has been largely overlooked since the late 1980's. The Lennard Shelf Project, comprising three sub-projects, covers an expansive area of ~319 km² and contains comparable geology to Pillara and the Cadjebut Trend.

Recent Activities

No on-ground activities were completed on the Lennard Shelf Project during the quarter.

Leinster Project:

The Leinster Project, located 30km southeast of Leinster, covers an area of 42km² and is prospective for nickel-copper being located along strike from Auroch Minerals the Horn and related Ni-Cu prospects and adjacent to BHP's Nickel West Weebo Ni deposit.

Recent Activities

No work was undertaken on the Leinster Project during the quarter.

Corporate:

Cash on hand as the end of the quarter was \$3.17M.

Albion continues to assess other opportunities as they are presented with a view to adding to the discovery potential within the Company's portfolio of projects.

Related Party Payments

Pursuant to item 6 in the Company's Appendix 5B – Quarterly Cashflow Report for the Quarter ended 30 September 2023, the Company made payments of \$40k to related parties which relate to existing remuneration arrangements (director fees and superannuation).

Exploration
