### COMMITMENTS TEST ENTITY - SECOND QUARTER REPORT

**SYDNEY, Australia, 24 January 2006:** Australian medical technology company, Sirtex Medical Limited (ASX: SRX) today announced a positive Quarter 2 Cash Flow report.

The results for the second quarter of the financial year show a positive net cash flow of \$1,456k, which is an increase of 87% over the previous quarter and results in Year-to-date positive cash flow of \$2,233k.

The positive cash flow in quarter 2 is a direct result of increased sales revenue and a reduction in capital expenditure at the new manufacturing facility at Wilmington, Massachusetts, USA.

Analysis of the Half Yearly results will be available as part of the half yearly report which is expected to be released by the end of February 2006.

Sirtex Medical Ltd is an international company, located in Australia, the United States and Germany. Sirtex Medical Ltd aims to become the world leader in liver cancer treatment products. The Company believes the unmet demand for effective treatment of liver cancer provides an opportunity for Sirtex products.
