Yes, the Company monitors its ongoing liabilities to ensure it has sufficient cash available to settle these as and when required as it continues to assess its recapitalisation options. As noted in 8.8.2, the Company has also received a letter of financial support from CREC confirming that they will provide financial assistance as is necessary to enable the Company to meet its working capital commitments as and when they fall due for the period of up to at least 30 March 2022.
