	On 4 March 2021 Xingang Resources (HK) Ltd agreed to extend the term of the existing unsecured loan from 31 December 2021 to 31 December 2025 at an interest rate of 2.5%, with repayment due at maturity of the loan. The original loan of \$4,000,000 plus accrued interest of \$504,650 forms the principal of this loan.		
	The Company signed a loan agreement with Rich Mark Development (Group) Pty Ltd on 4 February 2021 for \$4,800,000. The loan was available for drawdown in 6 tranches through to 31 March 2022. The loan is unsecured and subject to interest of 2.5%, which accrues six monthly and is payable along with the principle at maturity and matures on 31 January 2024.		
	The Company also signed a new loan agreement with Rich Mark Development (Group) Pty Ltd on 19 November 2021 for \$7,500,000. The loan is available for drawdown in 6 tranches through to 31 March 2023. The loan is unsecured and subject to interest of 2.2%, which accrues six monthly and is payable along with the principle at maturity and matures on 30 November 2026. During the current quarter, the Company drew down \$1,000,000 of this loan. The undrawn amount of the loan is \$300,000.		
	On 18 August 2022, the Company signed an agreement with Rich Mark Development (Group) Pty Ltd for a \$3,000,000 loan available for drawdown in three tranches starting January 2023. The loan is unsecured and subject to interest at 2.2% pa which accrues six monthly and is payable along with the principle at maturity. The loan matures on 31 December 2028. During the current quarter, the Company drew down \$1,500,000 of this loan. The undrawn amount of the loan is \$1,000,000.		
	On 15 February 2023, the Company signed an agreement with Rich Mark Development (Group) Pty Ltd for a \$3,000,000 loan available for drawdown in two tranches starting June 2023. The loan is unsecured and subject to interest at 3.0% pa which accrues six monthly and is payable along with the principle at maturity. The loan matures on 19 June 2028. The undrawn amount of the loan is \$3,000,000.
